City of Marysville officials set to declare State of Emergency following Marysville Hotel Fire

Marysville, CA – In response to the devastating impact of the recent fire at the historic Marysville Hotel, the City of Marysville City Council is expected to pass a resolution declaring a state of emergency to address the massive regional transportation disruptions and significant economic impacts stemming from this tragic event.

Marysville City Manager Jim Schaad, Fire Chief Kyle Heggstrom, Police Chief Christian Sachs, and representatives from Cal Trans District 3 will be present to address questions and concerns.

The Marysville Hotel fire has not only disrupted regional transit systems but also poses a severe threat to the local businesses community. The emergency declaration will enable the city to mobilize resources, seek state and federal assistance, and implement necessary measures to support recovery efforts.
