

EVENT MANAGEMENT AND SECURITY POLICIES

GOAL

It is our goal to provide entertainment while ensuring that patrons attending the [REDACTED] have an enjoyable time in a safe environment. The responsible management of alcohol on our grounds is a key component of achieving this goal. It is the responsibility of every employee to participate in this effort as a team.

Therefore, we encourage every employee to carefully read the following alcohol policies and procedures. They are designed to assist all of us in preventing and reducing problems associated with alcohol use, and to create a safe environment for our employees as well as our patrons.

POLICIES

Admissions

- Patrons will not be allowed to bring alcoholic beverages into the beer garden. Patrons will not be allowed to bring alcohol from the restaurant or patio into the beer garden or take beer from the beer garden out into the patio or restaurant. Beer in the beer garden will be served in plastic Budweiser glasses or plastic Coors and MGD bottles. Soda will be served in clear plastic glasses that are distinguishable from those served in the bar. No other containers will be allowed on premises.
- Minors will be allowed in the restaurant and in the beer garden until 10:00 pm only. The underage patron will be given a wrist band and informed "they will be asked to leave at 10:00 pm and soda are available inside. Drinking of alcohol will not be permitted or tolerated. If they remove the wrist band they will be asked to leave." This will also be posted at the entrance of the beer garden.

Sale of Alcoholic Beverages

- All servers, bartenders and security will be required to read our event's policies.
- Security, servers and bartenders have the right to stop or restrict alcohol sales at anytime.
- Security, servers and bartenders will not consume alcohol at any time during the event.
- Patrons must be at least 21 years old to be served alcohol.
- Patrons will be asked to remove the I.D. from the wallet.
- All patrons must show bonafide I.D. An I.D. is legally acceptable if it has ALL six of these things:
 - 1) Is issued by a ***governmental agency*** (such as federal, state, county or city)
 - 2) Contains the ***name*** of the person
 - 3) Contains the ***date of birth*** of the person
 - 4) Contains a ***description*** of the person
 - 5) Contains a ***photograph*** of the person
 - 6) Is currently ***valid*** (in other words, not expired)

Examples of legally acceptable I.D. 's are:

Driver's license
State-issued I.D. card

Examples of unacceptable are:

Temporary driver's licenses
Non-photo driver's licenses
Birth certificates
School or work I.D. cards

- If a patron shows a false I.D. they will be ejected. If the I.D. is confiscated a receipt must be issued and it must be turned over to Marysville Police Department at the end of the event.

A false I.D. is any altered, borrowed, stolen, counterfeit or forged I.D. If a false I.D. is presented, immediately contact security

Inform the patron they you are calling security and will temporarily hold the I.D. until security arrives.

If the patron chooses to leave without the I.D. before security the I.D. has become abandoned property.

If the patron remains until security arrives, security will make a determination of whether the I.D. is to be retained or given back to the patron and will escort the patron from the property.

ENFORCEMENT AND INTERVENTION

This is a Zero Tolerance event

- Minors caught drinking will be ejected from the event. If the minor is intoxicated law enforcement will be contacted and an incident report will be made.
- If a patron is observed passing alcohol to and underage patron, that person and the underage drinker will be ejected form the grounds, law enforcement may be notified and a report will be completed.
- Any patron being unruly or offensive will be asked to leave.
- Fighting will not be permitted. Police will be called and that person detained and an incident report will be filed. ***NO EXCEPTIONS!***
- All employees are to notify security when they observe a person who is impaired or obviously intoxicated. That person will be offered a safe ride home.(at our cost if necessary) If refused, licence plate and description of the car will be called into Marysville Police Department and an incident report will be filed.
- Documentation by security or alcohol servers will be completed and submitted to management for any actual or potential incidents. (Incident report)
- Persons in possession of unlawful items (e.g., weapons, drugs, false I.D.'s) will be ejected from the event and/or law enforcement be called.

PUBLIC AWARENESS

- Alcohol policies will be posted at both the entrance of the beer garden and at the beer trailer.

You must be 21 to purchase alcohol

You will be required to show proof of age to be served alcohol

There is a limit of 2 beers per person, per purchase, per I.D.

Alcohol service will cease at 1:30 am

- Announcements regarding not drinking and driving will be made whenever possible by the band during the event.

- We will allow minors until 10:00 pm as the kitchen will be open until then. At 10:00 pm the three roaming security personnel will make a sweep of the restaurant and the beer garden and ask all underage patrons to leave. This has worked very well in the past. I.D.'s will be rechecked and the bar and beer garden will become over 21 only with a security guard stationed on the front door. Our patrons will be I.D.'d in most cases several times by several employees. They will be told to keep their I.D.'s available.

- We will have at least six (6) security guards. All guards will be wearing black shirts with **LEAD** **SECURITY** on the back in large block letters and will be equipped with radios and are asked to furnish their own flashlight. The main bar and the beer garden will also have radios so they can contact security if needed. Security will have cell phones with MPD on speed dial. All will be either Lead Certified or will be well versed on ABC laws and our own policies regarding event security. A copy of our policies will be given to all security. Security will be placed:

One stationary at the gate of the patio (making sure no drinks leave the patio area)

One stationary at the entrance of the beer garden (checking I.D.'s and issuing wrist bands to minors)

One stationary the exit of the beer garden (making sure no drinks leave and telling incoming patrons to go to the entrance and have their I.D.'s ready)

One roaming inside the restaurant (checking I.D.'s, picking up bottles and listening for potential problems)

One roaming on patio (checking I.D.'s, picking up bottles, glasses, cleaning ashtrays and listing for potential problems)

One roaming in beer garden (checking I.D.'s, cleaning tables, cleaning ashtrays and listing for potential problems)

- If an indecent occurs and the roaming security needs the help of the stationary security, their post will be covered by an employee before leaving. All fights will be reported to the Marysville Police Department. All incidents will have an incident report taken. All security will fill out a form stating their full name, address and phone numbers prior to the event so they can be located if an incident occurs and the police need additional information.

- Our bartenders are all LEAD Certified and will be checking I.D.'s at the bar and at the beer trailer. Most of our servers are LEAD certified as well. All of our employees know how to check an I.D.
